
Although the 'potluck' picnic was attended by just a few gardeners, it was enjoyed by all who were lucky enough to partake in the fun.

# Volunteer Round-up

On June 15th, 2010 Starbucks, United Way, Nepean Rideau & Osgoode Community Resource Centre (NROCRC), NAGA and Baptists from Ottawa and Shelby North Carolina came together for an afternoon of volunteering to help spruce up the Nepean Allotment Gardens.



NAGA exec came together with the other agencies to help coordinate the logistics of the event and by June 15th we had well over 150 volunteers show up at the garden! A visiting group of youth Baptist missionaries from Shelby, North Carolina had caught wind of this event through a local chapter and both groups expressed an interest to get involved. The staff and board of NROCRC also offered their time and effort to make the day a success. United Way provided media coordination, free t-shirts and other gifts to volunteers and their staff also helped out in the gardens.



On the day of the event we watched 3 buses full of Starbucks employees arrive at the gardens followed by another large bus filled with youth. After a quick introduction, overview of the day and dividing into teams to complete the various tasks, the groups divided and conquered all tasks requested of them. Some of the volunteers even worked with Lee to get a huge bolder out of the ground in one of our back plots!
