NAGA Expansion Project:

During the first phase of the Community Garden Network funds allocations, NAGA received \$8,000 to start the expansion project, as originally submitted. However, when the soil test came back positive for the presence of undesirable substances, it was then necessary to steer this project towards building above ground planters.

With the help of two project managers, Mike Chebbo, NAGA's Chair and Lee Coates, one of NAGA's Director at Large, a revised project and budget proposal for building these boxes was quickly drafted and resubmitted for approval.

Two volunteer days were then established. A call to our current members and to some of the new gardeners whose names are on the waiting list was dispatched. You responded enthusiastically! About 20 volunteers showed up and within 4 hours, following the necessary lot preparations, we got to a roaring start on the building of 8 planters. The next volunteer day saw us proceed to the building of 4 more planters. We also got a visit from Ottawa's Mayor, Jim Watson and Ward 9, Councillor Keith Egli who have taken a keen interest in our project and our gardens in general.

These 12 planters were eventually completed and are now ready for the upcoming gardening season thanks to our hard working volunteers. Their participation ensured the successful completion of Phase One and for that we are truly grateful.

On November 15, 2012, an underground irrigation system connecting this new area to our main gardening site was installed, by going underneath the walkway and bicycle path. The underground water pipe extends over 300 feet in the newly added area.

The allocation of the new planters will be as follows:


1. First priority will be offered to current members who have physical limitations or preferences.

2. In exchange, these members will be required to give up a plot on the main gardening site. This will liberate 12 existing plots for new gardeners.

- 3. Any leftover planters will be assigned to new gardeners.
- 4. The rental fee for a planter will be \$20.00 for the season, which corresponds with our fees of half an annual plot or a perennial plot. A very affordable rate!

A total of 12 new members will be added to NAGA's family in 2013. As well, we have obtained a further \$4545 from CGN towards the building of five more planters in the coming season. We hope to see you at the building party!


